



Mixed conditionals

We use past perfect and clauses with **would** to talk about hypothetical events in the past that have effects on the present.

Examples:

If you **hadn't crashed**, you **would drive** your car to school.

If I **had been** more adventurous when I was younger, I **wouldn't have** any regrets.

If we **had lived** in an English-speaking country when we were little, we **wouldn't study** English today.

If I **hadn't bought** an economy ticket, I **would be** in a more comfortable seat now.

Structure:

If + subject + had/hadn't + verb in past participle, subject + would + verb in base form + complement
